

## REHEARSAL NOTES

**O Sing a Song of Bethlehem** is a lush setting of the English folk hymn tune Kingsfold which begins quietly, then increases in intensity until the final stanza which explodes with energy! Take special care at measure 28 to keep the upper sixteenth notes at a softer dynamic level than the melody beneath, and to keep them absolutely even and smooth. Absolute rhythmic accuracy is required in the final stanza.



**Matthew Compton** (b. 1994) is a Colorado Springs native who has been composing, arranging, and conducting music for handbells since 2007 when he was in the eighth grade. He had his first composition published at the age of 15, making him one of the youngest ever published handbell composers. An avid performer and listener, Matthew is known for his high energy originals and arrangements and beautiful harmonies, and his music has been performed across the world by many elite groups, including The Agape Ringers, The Alleluia Ringers of Concordia University Wisconsin, Pikes Peak Youth Ringers, and Hong Kong Youth Handbell Ensemble. His music has been selected for the repertoire for regional and national handbell festivals, including Distinctly Bronze East and Distinctly Bronze West. He is the new Artistic and Music Director for Bells of the Cascades of Portland, Oregon.
