PROGRAM NOTES

Raised in a rich musical environment in Cheltenham, England, the young Gustav Holst (1874–1934) was constantly surrounded by instrumental music. Military band performances in the town were quite frequent, and it was through this early exposure that his love of wind music took hold and continued to grow throughout his life. Taking up the trombone as a source of additional income (an instrument that, by all accounts, he played with a high degree of proficiency) also provided him with experiences that would serve him well in later years as one of most prominent British composers of the 20th century.

Several of Holst's works remain staples of wind band literature to this day. Three of these are excerpted and presented in this musically varied and colorfully scored medley:

"Intermezzo," the second movement of First Suite in E-flat (Opus 28, No. 1), written for military band.

"Song Without Words: I'll Love My Love," the second movement of *Second Suite in F* (Opus 28, No. 2), written for military band.

"March," the third movement of A Moorside Suite, written for brass band.

NOTES TO THE CONDUCTOR

As an introduction to the music of Holst for young players, for whom this piece will undoubtedly be their first experience, it might be a good idea to relay some background information about his life, and perhaps, of greater interest to them, share some of your own personal experiences about the first time you heard or played any of his music.

This scoring is straightforward, and all ranges are within the parameters of this level. A general teaching opportunity could be the explanation and demonstration of properly executing staccato technique, since all wind parts utilize this articulation.
