PROGRAM NOTES

American composer, producer, conductor, and film producer Brian Tyler wrote the music for the romantic comedy *Crazy Rich Asians*. Tyler was born May 8, 1972, in Orange County, California. His musical career began at an early age, but it wasn't until after he received his bachelor's degree from UCLA and his master's degree from Harvard University that he began to score features. Several of his previous works include the current *Formula 1* theme, *Iron Man 3*, *Avengers: Age of Ultron* with Danny Elfman, *Now You See Me*, and *Crazy Rich Asians*.

Crazy Rich Asians is the first Hollywood studio film to feature an all-Westernized Asian-American cast since 1993's The Joy Luck Club. The critically acclaimed movie, appealing to an ethnically diverse audience, has had great success at the box office. The story follows American Rachel Chu (Constance Wu) as she accompanies her longtime boyfriend Nick Young (Henry Golding) to his best friend's wedding in Singapore. As Rachel visits Nick's hometown for the first time, she quickly learns that her boyfriend is not only from one of the richest families in Asia, but also is one of its most eligible bachelors, putting a target on her back from jealous socialites as well as Nick's formidable mother, Eleanor (Michelle Yeoh).
