This thrilling arrangement is sure to get the adrenaline flowing. The bold and assertive melodies are as fun to play as they are to listen to. This piece is great for developing and refining the staccato bow stroke and tone development. A perfect festival piece or concert finale!

PROGRAM NOTES

Originally written for piano, the prelude is included in Rachmaninov's set of ten preludes. The piece is written in ternary (ABA) form with the opening A section marked Alla marcia, or march. The main theme is punctuated by a sixteenth-note motive that reappears throughout the work. The second theme proclaims itself with a grand opening while still making use of the sixteenth-note motive, this time in the lower strings. In contrast, the B section is marked meno mosso, or less quickly. Its ethereal nature is highlighted by the tremolo in the lower strings and a floating melody in the violins. A dominant version of the main theme starts the recapitulation as the piece accelerates and crescendos back into the march tempo to finish the work.

NOTES TO THE CONDUCTOR

Much of the work is marked staccato to best mimic the action of the piano. Special attention should be played to notes that do not include the staccato marking. The tremolo starting at m. 35 in the lower strings should be a wide and slow tremolo.

Note from the Editor

In orchestral music, there are many editorial markings that are open for interpretation. In an effort to maintain consistency and clarity you may find some of these markings in this piece. In general, markings for fingerings, bowing patterns, and other items will only be marked with their initial appearance.
