## PROGRAM NOTES

The 552nd Air Force Band was activated in 1942 at Pueblo Army Air Base, Colorado as the 52nd Army Air Force Band, and in 1944 was designated as the 552nd Army Air Force Band. A year later, the 552nd was assigned to the Air Transport Command in French Morocco, North Africa. The following year, 1946, the 552nd was attached to the New York State National Guard in White Plains, New York. Activated in 1951, during the Korean conflict, the unit was initially assigned to the Strategic Air Command at March AFB, California. In 1959, the 552nd was then relocated to the Roslyn Air Station, Long Island, New York and was finally relocated at Stewart International Airport in Newburgh, New York. The composer was a member from 1962 to 1968.

## NOTES TO THE CONDUCTOR

Set at  $\text{♩} = 116$ , the snare drum solo leads to the flute duet at measure 6 which is then embraced by the full ensemble at measures 15 and 32. The contrasting section (dynamically and instrumentally) at measure 41 leads again to the full ensemble at 57. The *rallentando* at measure 71 and the fermatas at measure 72 stage the tempo change at measure 73 at a stately  $\text{♩} = 92$  with a *poco a poco accelerando* to measure 81 where the tempo returns to the opening tempo at  $\text{♩} = 116$ . Here, in the woodwinds, contrasting lines are featured. These figures are shown as cues on the mallet percussion part on bells as an option. At measure 88, the dynamic drops sharply to *piano* then returns to *forte* at measure 90 and on to the conclusion.
