
## Skyline Drive







## Brasstown Bald Blues

Brasstown Bald located in the Chattahoochee-Oconee National Forest is the tallest mountain in Georgia. On a clear day, the half-mile hike to the top offers views to four states, including the skyline of Atlanta. The term "Bald" refers to a mountain devoid of trees on its summit, allowing a panoramic view of the countryside.













## Raven Rocks Rag

Raven Rocks, a spur of the Blue Ridge Mountains, begins in northern Virginia and follows the Appalachian Trail through hills and hollows before ending in West Virginia at an overlook with views of the Shenandoah Valley. Hikers have named the trail The Roller Coaster. The cliffs at Crescent Rock, a part of Raven Rocks, are popular with rock climbers.









## **Looking Glass Falls**

Looking Glass Falls is in western North Carolina in Pisgah National Forest. The roar of the falls demonstrates the water's powerful energy as it plunges to a natural swimming pool enjoyed by swimmers and waders in Looking Glass Creek. In winter, sheets of ice on its rocks sparkle in the sunlight. When frozen, the falls offer a challenge to ice climbers.
