ⓐ *Écossaise*, pronounced “ay-ko-sez,” is a French word meaning “Scotch.” The dance for which the music was composed does not have a Scottish origin, however. The *Écossaise* was a popular dance in $\frac{2}{4}$ time, usually used for beginning and ending an evening of dancing. Chopin and Schubert also wrote *Écossaises*, and they are commonly subtitled “Scotch Dances.”
