### **PROGRAM NOTES**

This traditional Irish tune has been beautifully arranged by Jim Palmer. The captivating melody, rich harmonies, and interesting accompaniment will help your young orchestra sound mature. Long phrases are highlighted with beautiful slurs and a variety of dynamics. Pizzicato, slurs, and ties create the interesting accompaniments. Well-developed phrases and unexpected chords provide opportunities for artistic expression. A perfect choice to teach a broad range of musical ideas.

#### NOTES TO THE CONDUCTOR

It is important to keep the bow speed smooth and steady throughout this piece. Use less bow on the pickup notes, so that they are not played with an accent. The long phrases will provide a wonderful opportunity for your students to arch the phrase. Pay close attention to the dynamics in the accompaniment so the balance is always blended.

When I arranged this piece, I thought it would be the perfect opportunity to reinforce or teach vibrato. With that in mind, challenge your students to vibrate every pitch including the pizzicato passages. Thank you for choosing *The Last Rose of Summer*. I hope you and your students enjoy playing it as much as I do!
