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NOTES TO THE CONDUCTOR

Hot House was composed by jazz pianist and composer Tadd Dameron in 1945. The song is based on the chord progression of Cole Porter's tune "What Is This Thing Called Love?", and Dameron's contrafact became an anthem of the be-bop area. There are many iconic performances of this piece by Dizzy Gillespie and Charlie Parker—most notably their 1953 Jazz at Massey Hall recording. There is also a 1952 video of Gillespie and Parker performing the tune that can be found on YouTube. Like the be-bop recordings, my arrangement is played in a swing style and adheres to the AABA form of the original.

The introduction begins with quotes of the tune's melody before settling into the melody at m. 9. Here, alto sax 1 and trumpet 2 state the melody for the first 24 measure of the first chorus. Throughout this passage, care should be taken not to overpower the alto and trumpet duo. In m. 18 and m. 20, there are optional lower notes for the melody as needed. At m. 33, alto and tenor saxes, guitar, and vibes (optional) state the melody of the last A section. Measure 41 begins the second chorus and a send-off passage for the trumpet 2 solo. Background figures from mm. 57–72 should not overpower the soloist.

The arrangement's third chorus begins at m. 73 and is comprised of a soli featuring the saxophone section that should build in intensity and peak at m. 100 and the ensuing stop-time passage from mm. 101–104.

The fourth chorus begins with the trumpet section stating the first four measures of the melody with an optional 8va part in trumpet 1. The alto sax solo begins at m. 109. The background figures at m. 113 (trumpets) and m. 129 (trumpets and saxes) are a variation of a Dizzy Gillespie short melody or "lick" that he employed in various formats but most famously in the background figures in his composition "One Bass Hit."



I highly recommend having your students check out Dizzy's big band recording of this tune and the YouTube post of his big band's 1946 performance of this great tune!

The "shout" and final chorus begins at m. 137. This passage should be played strongly and with a good sense of time, pitch and balance. Measure 153 features the drums soloing between the ensemble figures. The drum solo ends at the beginning of m. 160, and the final measures recap the melody.

I hope you and your students enjoy studying and playing this amazing Tadd Dameron composition, and I wish you the best for a successful performance!
