Cast of Characters and Costumes

48 candles are named by number or color, but feel free to use fewer (by combining lines) or even more (with a large "candle choir"). You may divide lines to feature as many students as possible or mount a smaller production with just one or two narrators. Everyone dresses as a taper candle, wearing a single-color tracksuit (or t-shirt), plus a candle flame hat or headband. Colors are important, as they symbolize the different holidays. Scatter your colors across the stage in a collage, group them together for an ombre or rainbow effect, or (even better) change positions a few times to create variety.

Props and Staging

Complete choreography is included throughout the score. The show both begins and ends with candle-lighting ceremonies. Please use battery-operated candles or inexpensive flashlights to achieve this beautiful effect. When not in use, turn the lights off and tuck them into a pocket until called for again. If you choose to invite the audience to participate with light during Song #9, cell phone flashlights or candle apps are effective and fun. Song #6 mentions a prop window frame and table—both are optional. Colorful silk scarves add joy to the Diwali celebration in song #7.

Set and Tech

It's so flexible! Here are just a few simple ideas. Use standard choral risers in your normal performance space. Optionally, decorate the stage with items that represent the holidays (menorahs, boughs of holly, kinaras, colorful rangolis, etc.). Place a few microphones at the front of the stage for spoken lines, which are delivered directly to the audience. Consider projecting holiday images or photographs on a large screen throughout the show. And plan on dimming the lights for both candle-lighting songs.



A Final Note

Embrace your creativity to make *Candles! The Musical* your own. If there are other holidays you're tempted to include, please do. Additional songs and new rhymes are encouraged. Just be sure to do plenty of research and check in with true culture bearers (experts on their own traditions) to ensure accuracy. The best production will be respectful and informative, entertaining and enlightening, and fully represent your community. Happy Holidays!


The cast slowly processes from the wings or through the audience with their lights shining—as more candles enter, we see more and more light.


