NOTES TO THE CONDUCTOR



This arrangement should be approached in a legato manner throughout. There are numerous teaching opportunities for slurring, legato tonguing, phrasing, intonation, and dynamic shaping. As always, feel free to adjust tempo and dynamics to suit your ensemble and performance venue. Note that the bass clarinet part goes down to low F, which may be a challenge at this level. Feel free to adjust the octave as you see fit.
