NOTES TO THE CONDUCTOR

The composer, Turlough O'Carolan, was one of the most memorable of his generation. Born in Ireland in 1670 and blind, O'Carolan made his living traveling from castle to castle composing and performing for the lords and ladies. His beautiful melodies still touch the heart. When playing *Captain O'Kane's Lament*, perhaps give your students the opportunity to create a story about the Captain. Did he return from sea to find a family member had passed away? Did his relatives commission the piece from O'Carolan after they learned he had gone down with his ship? What was the world like in the that time? This piece will definitely evoke emotions and feelings. With plenty of cross-curricular and music history discussion points, as well as musical expression, this piece will allow for growth and musicianship.
