#### INSTRUMENTATION

This is a wonderful arrangement of a classical work by an underrepresented composer. Detailed dynamics, bowings, and fingerings provide students the opportunity to experience the classical style. The rhythmic drive will make this work an excellent opener or closer for any festival or concert.

### NOTES TO THE CONDUCTOR

This arrangement is a wonderful example of music written in the classical style, much like W.A. Mozart. Quarter notes followed by quarter rests should be treated as releases. The repeated eighth-note figure should be played with a brush stroke in the lower third of the bow. Sixteenth notes should be played brilliantly on the string in the upper half of the bow. Dynamics have been added to achieve the classical style. Pay close attention to diminuendos to achieve tapered phrases, which are consistent with the classical style. Try to keep all articulations light and avoid unnecessary accents.

#### Note from the Editor

In orchestral music, there are many editorial markings that are open for interpretation. In an effort to maintain consistency and clarity you may find some of these markings in this piece. In general, markings for fingerings, bowing patterns, and other items will only be marked with their initial appearance.
