## PROGRAM NOTES

A Ray of Joy is a contemplative and emotionally resonant composition written about the love and admiration that I have for my parents, who are named Ray and Joy Gordon. My parents have always been a positive and encouraging light in my life, and writing a piece such as this is one of the ways that I always wished to honor them. The music begins with a delicate and evocative melody reminiscent of the first light of dawn breaking through a misty morning. The simplicity of the main melody beginning in measure five allows for a deep emotional connection, inviting the listener to reflect on moments of tranquility and happiness in their own lives.

The main theme that begins with the first violins in measure five was actually inspired by the intervals heard in a Ford Motor Company car door opening (P5 to a m3) and can be heard echoing throughout the piece. Writing this piece was a great reminder to myself that musical ideas and inspiration can come from anywhere, as long as you are willing to listen.

As you perform this piece, be sure to play as expressively as possible by utilizing long bows and vibrato while also carefully balancing the dynamic contrasts in each section to help convey a range of emotions, from moments of quiet introspection to the more soaring passages filled with joy.
