#### THE COMPOSER

Brian Balmages is known worldwide as a composer and conductor who equally spans the worlds of orchestral, band, and chamber music. His music has been performed by groups ranging from professional symphony orchestras to elementary schools in venues such as Carnegie Hall, the Kennedy Center, Sydney Opera House, Toronto Centre for the Arts, and many more. He is a recipient of the A. Austin Harding Award from the American School Band Directors Association, won the 2020 NBA William D. Revelli Composition Contest with his work *Love and Light*, and is an elected member of the prestigious American Bandmasters Association. Balmages was awarded the inaugural James Madison University Distinguished Alumni Award from the School of Visual and Performing Arts. In the same year,

he was commissioned by his other alma mater, the University of Miami, to compose music for the inauguration of the institution's 6th president, Dr. Julio Frenk. His music was also performed as part of the 2013 Presidential Inaugural Prayer Service, which was attended by both President Obama and Vice President Biden.

As a conductor, Mr. Balmages enjoys regular engagements with all-state and regional ensembles as well as university and professional groups throughout the world. Notable guest conducting appearances have included the Midwest Clinic, Western International Band Clinic, Maryborough Music Conference (Australia), College Band Directors Conference, American School Band Directors Association National Conference, numerous state ASTA conferences, Teatro dell'Aquila (Italy), and others. Currently, he is Director of MakeMusic Publications and Digital Education for Alfred and MakeMusic.

#### ABOUT THE MUSIC

Welcome to a massive party on the rails! Combining elements of dance, jazz, and Latin grooves, this piece seeks to blend these styles in a work that truly encapsulates the fusion concept. Inspired by words from Milford High School band director Bob Green, the piece is his way of celebrating the students who have persevered in the face of adversity over the past several years. In his own words, "I want to say thanks [to the administration and community] for giving me a chance, for keeping music and the kids as the focus, and thank you to the kids for never giving up."

Milford has an active train track that runs right through downtown. While the town itself is steeped in tradition, history, and community, it has also grown and embraced change. So while the tradition of the train continues to cut through the town (cutting through the downtown area four different times!), this music also symbolizes the evolution, change, and future that surround those tracks.

As mentioned, the work draws on several styles of music. At times, the piece moves cleanly from one style to the next; however, there are also sections that explore the fusion of these grooves and the themes themselves.

Ensembles have to approach this piece with an "all-in" attitude. I can envision conductors having sections stand up at points throughout the piece, and even have the entire ensemble up toward the end, moving and grooving to the music. Have fun with this one, because I had a TON of fun writing it!

Many thanks to Bob Green for trusting me with a piece that is so important to him. In the past several years, this idea of merging things together has benefited multiple bands in his district, and it is with this spirit in mind that I explore this fusion of styles in *Rail Riffs*.
