BWV refers to Bach-Werke-Verzeichnis (List of Bach's works). The number following this designation is the number assigned to the work in Wolfgang Schmieder's Thematische-Systematische Verzeichnis der Musikalischen Werke von Johann Sebastian Bach (Thematic-systematic List of the Musical Works of Johann Sebastian Bach). The prefix Anh. is used to designate numbers catalogued in the Anhang (Appendix) of the Schmieder list.

MENUET



Notice the sequential development used throughout this piece.

- (a) This ornament is a MORDENT. Play the written note definitely on the beat. As quickly as possible, play the next note below and return to the written note. See the discussion on page 5.
- (b) When the APPOGGIATURA occurs with a dotted note, it is usually given two-thirds of the value of that note. In the case of the above appoggiatura, however, it is better to give it only one-third of the value.

PRELUDE

IN C MAJOR

This ornament is called the *trilled turn*. It may be simplified as follows:



(b) Avoid a conspicuous break between the slurs.
