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FOREWORD

“How can I motivate this piano student?” is one of the most frequently asked questions we hear from teachers and parents. After many years of teaching experience, we are pleased to offer some help with the answer.

Pianists of any age are motivated by music they like and music they can play. The repertoire in this compilation satisfies both requirements. The pieces were chosen because they appeal to the showmanship in students and because they are accessible to pianists at the early intermediate through late intermediate levels.

Some pieces are short, making it possible to learn them quickly. Many of them have either repeated or parallel passages, decreasing the learning time even more. Because these pieces are easily learned, completing them creates a feeling of accomplishment. Less experienced pianists can feel and sound like virtuosos.

This collection includes music from all eras. Each piece incorporates a particular technique such as glissando, hand crossings, full chords and/or dramatic leaps, making each of them impressive and fun to play. Arranged in approximate order of difficulty, they may be used as recital “winners,” supplementary repertoire or as motivators to re-inspire a student.

These pieces have received enthusiastic responses. Many of our students have taken the initiative to learn the music on their own. Even more exciting to us is the obvious pleasure they experience as they practice and perform these **Recital Winners!**
