## Suggestions for Performance

If a full combo is not available, piano with drums or bass or guitar or piano alone (a strong pianist) may perform the composition. It is preferable for the guitarist to use the same voicings of the chords as indicated in the piano part.

If an above average or professional rhythm section is available, they are free to interpret the accompaniment as they desire as long as they retain the "rock" style.

The improvised section at C has three endings. When performed as a choral work (without Stage Band), the pianist may play as many choruses as desired. The three endings are only to be observed when the composition is performed with the Stage Band.
