One Church, One Faith, One Lord is a powerful anthem for World Communion, services emphasizing mission, stewardship, or he ordination/installation of church officers, for new member or confirmation Sunday or for Reformation Sunday. A suggested lectionary reading is Psalm 135. This anthem's basic homilitical theme is the Creator God as Sovereign of history and of works of His purpose.

This anthem requires clear enunciation of text and attention to its four-measure phrases. For ensemble precision between singers and ringers, a steady tempo should be maintained throughout, except for m. 43-54. During the rehearsal of this a cappella section, carefully balance and tune the vocal parts. Allow the church acoustic, ensemble sound, and text to shape the freer tempo of this section.

Eugene Butler is Director of Choral Activities and Music Theory at Johnson County Community College and Director of Music and the Arts at Valley View United Methodist Church, both in Overland Park, Kansas. The recipient of a master's degree in sacred music from Union Theological Seminary in New York and a doctorate in composition from the University of Missouri at Kansas City, Butler has over 550 published compositions.
