The Gift is a charming carol arrangement for Christmas Eve, Christmas Day, or Christmastide. A suggested corresponding lectionary reading is Luke 2: 1-20. One basic homilitical theme is that of the Creator of the Cosmos as peasant baby.

This much-loved carol is skillfully adapted for SAB choir alone or for combined SAB and unison children's choirs. When the two choirs join at m. 35, the unison children's choir is always supported on the melody by a section of the adult choir. In rehearsing this section, instruct the adults to sing only where they have the melody, which is traded from one part to another, while the children sing the melody in an unbroken line. Then carefully highlight this melodic chair through the dynamics indicated. The free-flowing keyboard accompaniment should remain rather relaxed and should be discreetly pedalled. The addition of handbells will insure a traly magical quality for this Christmas musical gift.

William Cutter lives in Boston, Massachusetts, where he is an Affiliate Artist at M.I.T., Composer-in-Residence for the Opera Lab, and an adjunct faculty member at the Walnut Hill School (High School) for the Performing Arts. With degrees in composition from Boston University, Dr. Cutter has numerous publications and commissioned works to his credit. He is a native of Dallas, Pennsylvania.
