## NOTES TO THE CONDUCTOR

This collection of holiday favorites is designed to serve as a complete concert program for beginning bands. I have indicated a variety of repeats and D. S. indications to elongate the duration of each movement. All repeats are optional, however, and can be changed any way that you feel is appropriate. The first movement is a fanfare for young musicians using a potpourri of famous carols. The tempo should be quick, but the players should perform this movement in a marcato fashion throughout. Movement two is a way for you and your band to help celebrate Hanukkah, the festival of lights. Movement three is a woodwind feature based on the carol JOLLY OLD ST. NICK. The percussion parts in this movement should be very light and add the feeling of motion, but should not overpower the woodwind sound. Movement four is a brass feature based on the famous carol JINGLE BELLS. The optional alto saxophone part is added to support the horns if needed (you may omit this part if desired). The last three bars of this movement are a fun way to jazz it up a bit! Movement five is a percussion feature with low brass and woodwind accompaniment. The percussive sounds should dominate; the lower voices should simply set the mood of the movement. Please make sure the bells can be heard on the melody. Also, the chime part and timpani part are both optional throughout the entire arrangement. Finally the sixth movement completes your concert with a frolicking version of WE WISH YOU A MERRY CHRISTMAS. Feel free to repeat as often as you like; it might be nice to play through the movement once and then ask the audience to sing along. You can use your imagination. Just remember to have fun with the "Oh, yeah!" ending!

It has been my pleasure to have the opportunity to write this arrangement, and I hope you find it enjoyable and useful in your program.
