PROGRAM NOTES

TO HONOR, THANK AND REMEMBER is the second work in the Sacred Heart Jr./Sr. High School Knight Band's "Young Band Commission Series on the Human Experience." The YBCS was created to add both quality literature by outstanding composers to the young band repertoire and to provide avenues of discussion or action on issues or events that have affected the human experience. This project was funded in part by the Horizons Program of the Salina, Kansas, Arts and Humanities Commission. Funding for Horizons comes from Horizons 50—a private donor group—and the City of Salina, Kansas.

TO HONOR, THANK AND REMEMBER was premiered in May 2001 with the composer and 25 World War II veterans in attendance.

NOTES TO THE CONDUCTOR

TO HONOR, THANK AND REMEMBER consists of three contrasting sections, each depicting a word in the title. In the "Honor" section at the beginning, great attention sould be given to ensemble performance and uniform note releases.

The melodic line in the saxes, horns, and baritone at measure 19 should be as flowing and lyrical as possible.

The snare drum beginning at measure 52 should be played by one player. At measure 56, I have suggested conducting in two. However, you may wish to stay in four for the sake of rhythmic security.

The return of the snare drum at measure 102 should this time be played by all snare drummers. The addition of field snares at this point would greatly add to the desired bombastic effect.
