#### STUDY THESE PICTURES AND THE FOLLOWING IMPORTANT POINTS:

- 1. GOOD BOY POSTURE.
- 2. THE LEFT HAND SUPPORTS THE WEIGHT OF THE INSTRUMENT, THE RIGHT HAND IS RELAXED.
- 3. THE INSTRUMENT SLANTS SLIGHTLY DOWNWARD TO CONFORM WITH THE NATURAL ANGLE OF THE JAW.
- 4. THE MOUTHPIECE IS IN THE CENTER OF THE LIP; THE MUSCLES AT THE CORNERS OF THE MOUTH ARE FIRM, BUT CONTROLLED.
- 5. THE CHEEKS ARE NOT PUFFED OUT.
