Technic Books

TECHNIC TODAY, PART TWO — James Ployhar Correlated with entire method (Correlated TECHNICAL EXERCISES and MELODIOUS ETUDES designed to reinforce material learned in the method. TECHNIC TODAY is an excellent companion book and should be used right along with the basic method.)

ROLLS

ROLLS for percussion instruments are indicated with three flags through the stem of the note. The purpose of the flags is to actually divide the note into thirty-second notes.



The Tambourine

When a roll is indicated use a fast back and forth twisting motion from the wrist and forearm,

Usually rolls are started by striking the head with the fingers of the free hand.

The Triangle

A roll is made by rapidly alternating strokes between the closed corners.



Maracas

When a roll (a sustained sound) is indicated hold the maracas up and make a circular motion.






The Suspended Cymbal

Medium soft vibraphone mallets or timpani sticks are excellent for a roll. The roll is made with rapid single strokes. Always keep the mallets on opposite sides so the cymbal will stay level.
