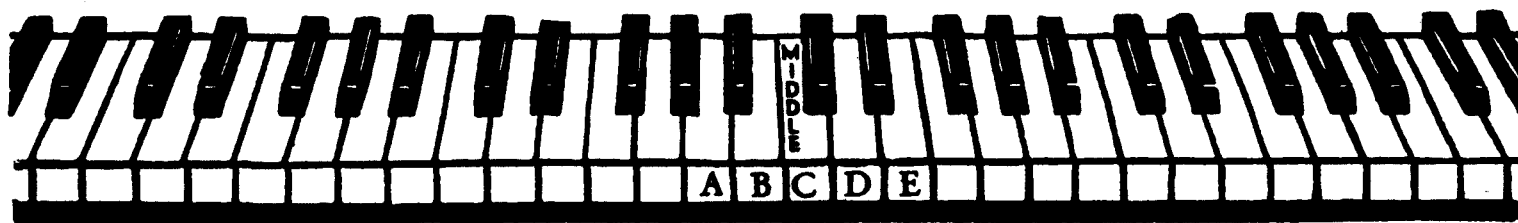


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THE SCHAUM KEY FINDER

If you know these keys, you're all set to play the pieces on the next two pages.

NOTE TO TEACHERS: It is recommended that the John W. Schaum "Note Speller" be introduced at this point.

The John W. Schaum "Keyboard Chart", which fits back of the black keys of the piano, is a splendid tool to assist the student to help himself.

Play each piece at least five times daily. Practice in two ways: say the letter names as you play, and count as you play.

1. AT SEA LEVEL

(or On the Level It's C)

Four counts per measure
Quarter note = 1 count
