THEORY, Primer Level, is directly correlated with LESSONS, Primer Level, of the David Carr Glover METHOD for PIANO.






# The Grand Staff


The treble and bass clefs joined together by a BRACE and BAR LINE form the GRAND STAFF.

The short line added between the treble staff and the bass staff is the MIDDLE C line.

A double bar comes at the end of a piece.



15. Trace the BRACES and BAR LINES to make GRAND STAFFS. Draw a treble and bass clef sign on each grand staff. Trace the Middle Cs. Draw a double bar at the end of each grand staff.



16. Draw UP or DOWN stems on these notes, changing them to half notes.
