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### NOTES TO THE CONDUCTOR

This blues has a medium swing tempo of 120 bpm. The introduction begins with a pedal bass note in unison with the rhythm section and baritone sax. The altos and tenors should swing the eighth notes, playing in thirds until the brass section takes the melody at bar 8. The brass section melody begins in unison and then breaks into harmony in bar 12. Keep the brass fairly light through measure 23. The saxes answer the melody with a swinging line similar to the introduction. The contrasting sax section lines are critical to the swing feel throughout this section. The saxes grab the melody in unison with pickups to the bridge at measure 24, with the brass offering the contrasting swing lines. The brass section is in again at 32 to the end of the first chorus. Watch out for the brass section rhythm at measure 32 because it's different from that stated at measure 9. Measure 39 is a brief interlude with a pedal B-flat in the brass and rhythm. The baritone sax and bass can play out here. The saxes come back with the harmonized melody at measure 43 for 16 bars. Watch out for first and second endings. During the written 1st Trumpet solo at measure 53, please make sure the saxes stay under the solo trumpet. The ending restates the feel from the intro. Keep the swing feel going right up until the last note has a fermata; however, if desired, the conductor can cut off on beat 4.

This is a wonderful melody that offers plenty of opportunity to teach the swing feel to the beginning jazz player. Please enjoy.
