Editor's Note

Franz Joseph Haydn (1732-1809) was one of the most celebrated Austrian composers of the Classic era. Known for his influence in establishing the Classical style in the eighteenth century, Haydn composed numerous instrumental and vocal works in the various forms of his day.

This publication provides the first section of the Gloria movement found in Haydn's "Mariazellermesse." Also called "Missa Cellensis in C," Haydn composed the work for the monastery at Mariazell in 1782. It is unlike his last six masses which were composed on a much larger scale.

Haydn's Gloria has been transposed down a major second from the original. Scores originally for S.A.T.B. voices with an orchestral accompaniment of oboes, clarini (high trumpets), timpani, strings and continuo, this new edition includes a keyboard reduction of the instrumental parts as the accompaniment. Dynamic indications, a tempo indication of $\text{♩} = \text{ca. } 108$ and optional English words have also been added by the editor. An arrangement of this chorus for S.A.B. voices is also available (OCT02576).

This joyful hymn of praise should be conveyed in performance by a very rhythmic and energized presentation, always emphasizing the normally stressed syllables. Accent marks are indicated over those syllables in the following Latin pronunciation guide.


