Editor's Note

Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart (1756-1791) was one of the most notable composers of the Viennese Classical style and is highly revered today as one of the most important composers of all time. Known for his ability to compose in the many forms of the Classical era, his contributions to sacred choral music consisted of Masses, a Requiem, and many miscellaneous works for various performance occasions.

This publication provides the latter portion of the *Agnus Dei* movement found in Mozart's "Missa brevis in C," K.259. Composed for use in the main worship service of the Catholic Church, a Missa brevis (brief Mass) in Mozart's time was quite concise and few instruments were employed. Mozart originally scored this Mass for SATB voices with an accompaniment of strings, trumpets, timparis organ and continuo.

Composed in Salzburg in December, 1776, it was performed at the consecration of the Archbishop of Olmitz in 1778. It is often called the "Organ Mass," because the organ in the Benedictus movement sounds an expressive obligato solo in contrast to the four vocal soloists, rather than functioning as a mere support.

The source for this edition is **W. A. Mozart's Sämtliche Werke, Series I/II, published by Breitkopf and Härtel** (1876-1905). This arrangement of the "Dona nobis pacem" section for SAB voices includes a keyboard reduction of the instrumental parts as the accompaniment. Modern clefs, metronomic and dynamic indications, an optional flute part and an English version of the original Latin text have also been added by the editor. The first eight measures and concluding three measures of accompaniment are also additions to the original score. An arrangement of this chorus for SSA voices is also available (OCT9817).

Dona Nobis Facem should be performed very smoothly and expressively, always emphasizing the normally energized syllables. Accent marks are indicated over those syllables in the following Latin Pronunciation guide.
