Performance Notes

The “Hallelujah” chorus is from George Frideric Handel’s oratorio, the *Messiah*. (An oratorio is a sacred work, much like opera, that originally was not intended to be sung in a church.) The *Messiah* is considered one of the most popular examples of choral music from the Baroque period (1600–1750). Written by Handel in 1741 in Dublin, Ireland, it is still performed throughout the world, particularly during the Christmas and Easter seasons, although it can be performed anytime during the year. Handel’s name, like Bach’s, is synonymous with the Baroque era. Beethoven (1750–1820), one of the greatest composers of the Classical period, said: “Handel is the greatest composer who ever lived.”

Handel wrote the *Messiah* in the fall of 1741 when he was 56 years old, a mere 21 days after having suffered a stroke. The work received its premier performance in Dublin on April 13, 1742. It is said that King George II stood during the “Hallelujah” chorus when it was sung at its second London performance in 1743. Since then, it is a tradition that everyone stands when the “Hallelujah” chorus is sung. When you perform this work, it would be appropriate for the conductor to turn and motion for the audience to stand.

This arrangement has been written to make this timeless work accessible for younger or less-experienced voices. The original “Hallelujah” chorus was written for four voices—soprano, alto, tenor, and bass—and orchestra in the key of D major. In order to limit the ranges of the separate voice parts, the key was lowered in this arrangement to B-flat major, and some of the counterpoint (different moving voices) is assumed by the piano. The piano reduction was also written so that, with some practice, it will be relatively easy for most pianists to play while still capturing the flavor and majesty of this work.

I do hope you will enjoy singing this masterpiece by Handel.
