Langston Hughes, American poet, novelist, editor and playwright, made his indelible mark on American literature for nearly fifty years. The focus of the majority of his works is the experience of the black man in America, his sorrows, joys, hopes and dreams. Many of his works reflect great sadness for oppression yet coupled with optimism for the future. DREAMS is from a collection of poems entitled THE DREAM KEEPER and Other Poems, first published in 1932.

The simple imagery and eloquence of this poem provides a wide variety of optional educational activities using the visual arts, creative movement and discussion.

Performance suggestion: This piece is ideally performed very legato, with little or no vibrato, and with careful attention given to the shaping of phrases and clarity of tone.
