THE REINDEER TWIST

Two-Part, accompanied, with optional audience participation





*Do the twist from 21 to 33. Place feet apart, one slightly in front of the other. Bend knees slightly and rotate your hips. Hold arms as though you're riding a bike and let them rotate freely as you twist.



*Use your hands as antiers. Place thumbs on head slightly above ears. Spread fingers wide apart. There, now you have antiers! Follow the choreography above from 33 to 43. When you sing the words "Shake your antiers," you should wiggle your fingers. (Note: Do not twist in this section.)



*The fourth verse, in which audience members are asked to come up and twist, is optional. To delete this verse take the second ending after 67.



*The second time through, the piano vamps measure 55 and 56 as the choir continues to clap.

As the music is playing, a few choir members go into the audience and select people to come up and twist. When these choir members and their "volunteer" partners are in front of the choir, the music continues, on cue, at 57.

P.S. Rudolph told me that your school principal is an excellent twister!



- * Do the twist from 59 to the first/second ending.
- ** Do the same choreography as before from 59 to the first/second ending.
- ***At the North Pole, it's considered good concert etiquette if the accompanist stands and does the twist while playing from 59 to the first/second ending.
