Editor’s Note

Antonio Vivaldi (1678-1741) was a famous violinist and composer in Venice, Italy during the Baroque era. He is especially revered today for his instrumental works, which include over four hundred concertos and almost one hundred sonatas. He is also known for his liturgical choral works, of which the GLORIA is best known and most performed.

Born to a musical family, Vivaldi studied violin and composition before entering the seminary to study for the priesthood. After becoming ill, he left the active service of the church and accepted a position as a teacher and conductor at the Conservatory of the Pieta in Venice, a school for homeless girls. As choirmaster at the school, he composed numerous sacred works for various church services. In addition to teaching at the school, he made numerous appearances around Europe for the performances of his various operas. Because of his continued absences from the school, he was eventually fired from that position. He spent his final days in Vienna, where he died in poverty.

Gloria Patri is the concluding section of “*Lauda Jerusalem*,” which is a setting of Psalm 147. The tradition of ending a psalm with a doxology in praise of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit can be traced to early Jewish and Christian times.

Vivaldi originally set this chorus for two SATB choirs, two string orchestras and two organs. This arrangement of Choir I for SAB voices features an optional trumpet part which sounds the original soprano part of Choir II as well as new material provided by the editor. This new edition also includes a keyboard reduction of the instrumental and vocal parts as the accompaniment. Optional English words, tempo and dynamic indications and a ritardando and fermata have been added by the editor.

This joyous work should be sung very energetically and rhythmically, always emphasizing the normally stressed syllables. Accent marks are indicated over those syllables in the following Latin pronunciation guide.


