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
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
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
Talk to the animals

Leslie Bricusse wrote both the script and song score for the film of *Dr. Dolittle* in 1967. It was revived as a West End musical over thirty years on with Philip Schofield in the lead role. Bricusse collaborated with Anthony Newley (who was in the film) on a number of projects, and together they wrote the words to the title song of the James Bond movie *Goldfinger*.

This song needs humour! Think comedy. The tune itself is very straightforward, but what you do with it (especially in the middle section) will give the piece its character. Remember: there is always more to a piece of music than technique.
