INTRODUCTION

This is the collection you've been waiting for - swinging organ combo versions of your favorite songs to play on. Most of these tunes have appeared in piano-bass-drums versions on earlier Aebersold albums, but Hank Marr's organ playing sheds a whole new light on these tunes, and drummer Steve Davis keeps the pots on.

Invitation caught on in the sixties to become one of the most popular session tunes because of its extended chords which belie its original 1952 composition date. Just Friends came into the repertoire via Charlie Parker's record with strings in the early fifties; Bird also liked to play Out of Nowhere, The Nearness of You and Star Eyes. Ceora, written by Lee Morgan in the sixties, has just come into its own in the last decade or so. Jamey has written Down And Up as a tribute to the great Blue Note jazz songs of the 60's. Miles Davis popularized On Green Dolphin Street and I Fall In Love Too Easily for jazz audiences, and Duke Ellington gave us It Don't Mean A Thing and (with an assist from sideman Juan Tizol) Caravan. Billie Holiday recorded a memorable version of Easy Living, followed by recordings by trumpeters Clifford Brown and Lee Morgan. Tommy Dorsey staff arrangers Axel Stordahl and Paul Weston teamed up with lyricist Sammy Cahn to write Day By Day (this same team also wrote I Should Care, on Aebersold Vol. 23). Moonglow was introduced to many ears by a classic Benny Goodman Quartet recording. Stella By Starlight is a favorite jazz vehicle from a long forgotten movie of 1944. You Stepped Out of A Dream first appeared in 1940, but didn't become popular in jazz circles until the fifties. By contrast, The Shadow of Your Smile appeared in 1965 and was recorded by Dizzy Gillespie before the year was out; soon after that many jazz versions appeared.

It is interesting to note how many of these tunes were originally written for the movies; it is probably no coincidence that many jazzmen were known for their love of movies, even before the era of late night television. Charlie Parker was famous for spending untold hours in movie houses, watching the same double feature repeatedly.

Structurally, all these tunes fit the 32 bar song forms, either AABA or ABAC except for *Invitation*, which is made of three sections, each 16 bars long. These tunes were not chosen for analytical reasons, however; they're on this record because jazz musicians like to play them, as the length of the discography indicates. If you know the tunes on this album thoroughly, you'll have a good foundation for a personal repertoire.
