About the Composer

Brian L. Monroe has been a music educator with over thirty years of experience with concert band, jazz ensemble, marching band, and music theory/history from fifth grade through high school. His bands were honored at state and national levels and he is active as a clinician and adjudicator. He holds degrees from Kent State University where he studied percussion with Michael Burritt and composition with Thomas Janson and Walter Watson. He also studied with J. Rex Mitchell.

Program Notes

The building sits empty, yet it has a presence. On the outside, it looks grand and sturdy. On the inside, it's dark, with shadows that are ever-moving and mysterious. It seems eerily cooler, and the silence is broken by faint, unmistakable sounds that can't be described. The shadows seem to grow darker, even as the sun rises higher in the sky. Is there something in here with us? Is the abandoned granary not as empty as it seems?

Performance Notes

Take care to observe dynamics. They are a unifying element in this composition and must be observed if the band is to achieve the maximum effect. Play the flexatone loudly and hold it as high in the air as the player can reach. You want the audience to both see and hear its unique sound. Vocal effects should be highly exaggerated. Young players are often hesitant with vocal techniques which diminishes their effectiveness.

Leroy Anderson's (1908-1975) "Scottish Suite" (1954) originally had four movements: "The Bluebells of Scotland", "The Campbells Are Coming", "Bonnie Dundee", and "Turn Ye To Me". While he conducted the entire suite on three performances in 1954 and 1955 with the Cleveland Symphony Orchestra, the Cincinnati Symphony Orchestra, and the University of Miami Summer Symphony, in 1956 Anderson withdrew "The Campbells Are Coming", "Bonnie Dundee", and "Turn Ye To Me" because he was not satisfied with them. Anderson recorded "The Bluebells of Scotland" on June 25, 1954. He later arranged the work for concert band, and now sheet music for "The Bluebells of Scotland" is available for both full orchestra and concert band from the publisher. A full score is included with the band version while a condensed score is available separately.
