#### **FOREWORD**

This workbook presents basic music theory intended to supplement any Level One method book and for <u>all ages</u>. Melodic and harmonic <u>interval reading</u> are emphasized because of their importance for note reading and for training the <u>sense of touch</u>. The student should become accustomed to the <u>feeling between the fingers</u> to form the space needed to play each interval. The scale fundamentals presented here lay the groundwork for more analytical study of scales later. <u>Scale fingerings</u> for both hands are shown separately on the back inside cover.

The pages should be checked and corrected <u>before</u> the "keyboard assignment" is started. Regular <u>keyboard practice</u> <u>of these workbook pages is essential</u> to reinforce the learning process. A brief <u>music dictionary</u> is on page 32.

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
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#### **Lesson 8: 6th and 7th Melodic Intervals**

**DIRECTIONS:** Write the letter name in the box *below* each note. Compare the two notes in each measure. If the notes move UP, count the interval by going *forward* in the musical alphabet. If the notes move DOWN, count *backward* in the alphabet. Write the interval number in the large box *above* each measure.




**KEYBOARD ASSIGNMENT:** Find the notes in each measure. Say the interval number aloud as you play the last note in each measure. Do this three times per day.

### Lesson 16: F Major and G Major Scale Construction

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The steps of the ladder show the eight *degrees* of the major scale. The *Half steps* are placed closer together between 3 - 4, and 7 - 8. The others are *Whole steps*.


H = Half step W = Whole step

Notes of the *F Major Scale* and *G Major Scale* are shown below with scale *degree* numbers. The letter H shows the location of the two *Half steps* in each scale. In *F Major*, one *flat* has to be added. In *G Major*, one *sharp* has to be added.

**DIRECTIONS:** Add a sharp or flat where necessary to make the pattern of *Whole steps* and *Half steps* for each major scale. Write letter names, including the correct sharp or flat, on the line below each note.



**KEYBOARD ASSIGNMENT:** After completing the written work, play the F Major and G Major scales with each hand; use the fingering shown on page 32. Do this three times each day.
