In the year 1858, on the sixteenth of May, Frank Lynes was born in Cambridge, Massachusetts. His musical training was acquired at the New England Conservatory in Boston where Benjamin Lang instructed him in piano and organ. John K. Paine was his harmony teacher. His career consisted of many musical activities: pianist, organist, teacher, conductor and composer. He wrote chamber music, piano pieces, part songs and vocal solos.

Rustic Sonatina

William Dawson Armstrong was born in Alton, Illinois on February 11, 1868. He studied piano and composition in St. Louis under Ernest Kroeger. In Chicago, he mastered the organ under the tutelage of Clarence Eddy. He was the solo organist at the St. Louis World Fair. In 1908, he opened his own music school in Alton, Illinois. His compositions include an opera, an orchestral suite, an overture and numerous vocal and piano pieces.
