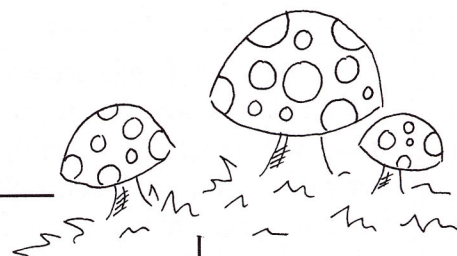
Notes with stems UP are to be played with the *right* hand. Notes with stems DOWN are to be played with the *left* hand.
