

Mozart (1756-1791)

Symphony No. 39 K543 (1788)

Theme from 3rd Movement

Ludwig von Köchel (KESH-el) was an admirer of Mozart. Köchel compiled a descriptive catalog of all of Mozart's music, listed in chronological order. In Köchel's catalog, the code number K543 means it was the 543rd composition written by Mozart.

This enormous task was not started until 60 years after Mozart's death. Köchel carefully studied all of Mozart's manuscripts, taking eleven years to complete the catalog.

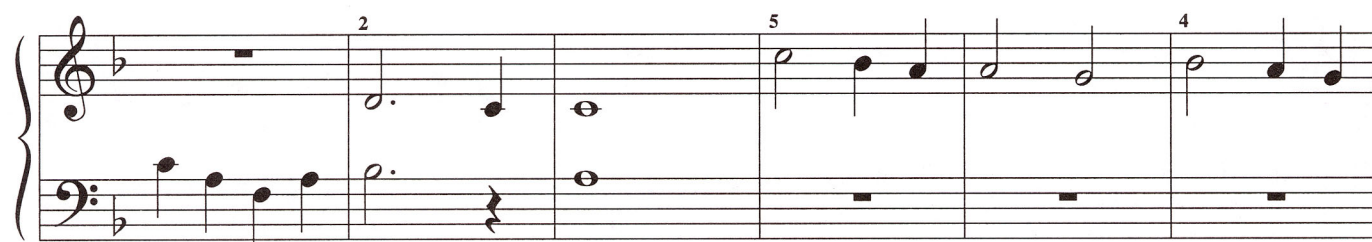
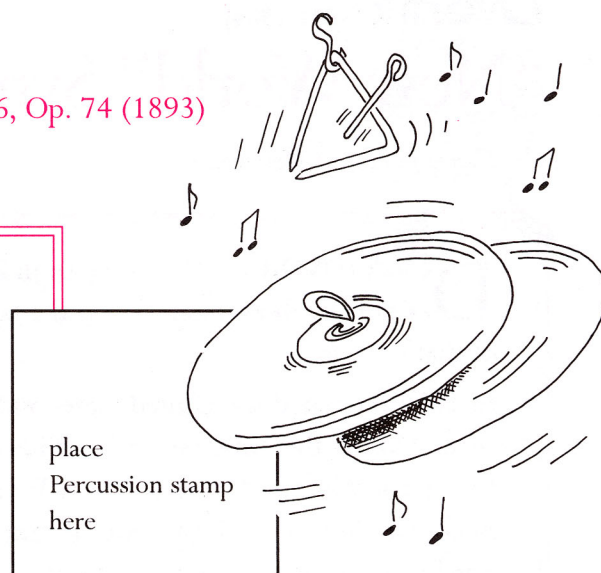
Tchaikowsky (1840-1893)

"Pathétique" Symphony No. 6, Op. 74 (1893)

Theme from 1st Movement

Tchaikowsky's Sixth Symphony is called the "Pathétique" (pah-thuh-TEEK) because of the sombre mood of the music. This was the last piece of music he wrote. He died nine days after its first performance.

The percussion family of instruments consists of the tympani (kettledrums), bass drum, snare drum, chimes, gong, celeste and many smaller instruments including cymbals and triangle.
