4. Iesus Loues Me, This I Know

This song was written by Anna Warner in 1859 for her book, "Say and Seal". The story in her book tells of Johnny, a little orphan boy, who was seriously ill. His Sunday-school teacher visited and read stories to him. Just before Johnny died, his teacher taught him this song. The book became a best-seller and this song became so famous that it has been translated into different languages all over the world.

William Bradbury, an organist, wrote this music in 1861. He liked children and was very much interested in Sunday schools.





15. Children of the Heavenly King



In 1742, John Cennick originally wrote twelve verses for this hymn. However, only three to six stanzas are used now. Cennick, an English evangelist, wrote about 500 songs during his life. This hymn is one of the few that is still sung today. The music is adapted from a string quartet written by Ignace Pleyel in 1791. Playel was a student of Joseph Haydn.
