The numerous chamber works of Georg Philipp Telemann (1681-1767), which are often unjustly underestimated, are well worth listening to. He was a very popular composer in his day and wrote music for many genres from operatic works to solo keyboard. This work is one movement from the Flute Sonata for flute and strings.

The articulations have been added by the arranger. Feel free to change them but keep them consistent throughout the movement. The flutes who pass off the majority of the melody must aim to match articulations exactly-it should sound like one person.
