Antonio Vivaldi (1678-1741) is best known as a composer of concertos. He wrote ov various instruments. For many years he was the music director at a private school and it was here large number of concerti for his students.

This concerto, originally for strings, is a typical work of Vivaldi's, demonstrating his gift for "tune", melodic material that burns such pieces as the Four Seasons into the memory of musicians and nonalike.

Pizzicato-like accompaniment is played under the soaring legalo solo line. This is a great piece that can be played on many occasions.
