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## The Composer

Travis J. Weller is an active arranger, composer, educator and advocate of music education. He has been the Director of Bands at Mercer Area Middle-Senior High School since August of 1995. He earned his bachelor's degree in Music Education from Grove City College, and his master's degree in Music Education from Duquesne University. In addition to his teaching duties at Mercer, Travis is a Philosophical Doctoral Candidate in Music Education at Kent State University.

Travis has served as a District President and County Representative for the District 5 Chapter of the Pennsylvania Music Educators Association. Travis is also a member of Phi Beta Mu (Nu Chapter), ASCAP, and the National Band Association. He has been a guest clinician in music education at various colleges and universities for secondary methods classes and PMEA workshops including Grove City College, Slippery Rock University, Westminster College, and Duquesne University, and he presented at the 2009 and 2011 PMEA State Conferences. He has authored several articles in journals and magazines including *The PMEA Journal* and *Learning and Leading with Technology*. He has been a guest conductor for numerous honor bands

in Pennsylvania and was the featured composer for the East Stroudsburg North Composer in Residence Series in 2010.

As a composer, Travis' piece *Journey to the Prairie* received 3<sup>rd</sup> place in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Annual Frank Ticheli Composition Contest. He has received several J.W. Pepper Editor's Choice nominations, *Bandworld* Top 100 nominations, three ASCAP Plus Awards, and many of his works have been reviewed by *The Instrumentalist*. His pieces for band have been performed by groups ranging from elementary to the collegiate level. Notable performances have been given by Grove City College Wind Ensemble, Westminster College Wind Ensemble, the River City Youth Brass Band (Pittsburgh), the Marks Concert Band (Hermitage, Pa.), The Florida State Summer Wind Ensemble, the Carnegie Mellon Pre-College Summer Wind Ensemble, Youngstown State University Band, The VanderCook College Symphonic Band (Midwest Clinic), and the PMEA 2012 All-State Concert Band.

Travis resides in Mercer with his wife Beth, their three daughters and a son.

## About the Music

*Jubilant Flourishes* is a brilliant and joyful concert written as an opener for a high school band concert. After a bold introduction, a buoyant melody emerges from the lower voices of the ensemble surrounded by brief fanfares and punctuations that resonate throughout the rest of the piece. The "flourishes" that surround it exist in rapid, running woodwind passages, and short punctuations by the various sections. The material in the transition to measure 80 sets a unique, dark contrasting section that leads to a recapitulation of the secondary theme first heard at measure 41. The main melody returns briefly at measure 130 before a series of bold fanfares bring the piece to an exciting finish.

## Rehearsal Notes

The opening hits an apex at measure 21. Be sure to get proper dynamic contrast from the ensemble on the *fp* so the clarinet, French horn, trombone, and baritone line can cut through. Encourage the melody line to play with a full, rich, buoyant sound as the main melody enters at measure 25, and balance the flourishes so they complement the lower voices.

Both sections at measure 41 and measure 112 provide important thematic contrast though they each have different tonal centers. Recommend the ensemble to play in the same style in both sections, listening to each other for balance, articulation, and dynamic levels. In both instances the building energy at the end of the section leads to a return of the main theme.

The percussionists are integral throughout the work to help establish a consistent, steady tempo that allows the flourishes and fanfares to unfold. I would suggest that the timpani player use a hard, staccato mallet throughout the work to allow the instrument to speak. Their entrances at various points add dramatic moments that really make the work shine.

I hope this piece is a wonderful experience for you and your ensemble. It is vibrant, exciting, joyous, and uplifting — just like our experiences in the arts should be for every student. I thank you in advance for your support of this music and wish you and your ensemble well!
