The Composer

Mekel Rogers has been involved in music education as a middle school band director since 1995. He is a *summa cum laude* graduate of Appalachian State University, a charter member of the Carolina Crown Drum and Bugle Corps, and the founding conductor of the Union Symphony Youth Orchestra. Mekel is also active as a frequent guest clinician and adjudicator for both concert band and marching band events.

The compositions for concert band that Mekel has written for The FJH Music Company Inc. have received several Editor's Choice Awards from the J. W. Pepper Music Company. In addition, works written by Mekel have been performed nationwide at various district and state honor band events, music educator association conferences, adjudicated festivals, and the Midwest Clinic in Chicago. International performances include concert band festivals in Canada and Australia as well as world premieres in London, England and Paris, France.

Mekel was inducted into the American School Band Directors Association (ASBDA) in 2008 and is a member of the American Society of Composers, Authors, and Publishers (ASCAP). He lives in North Carolina with his wife and daughter and performs occasionally with the Quintessence Wind Quintet.

About the Music

The Slavs are a large ethnic group of people with similar cultures and languages that inhabit a number of countries in Central and Eastern Europe including (among others) the Czech Republic, Poland, and the Ukraine. *Slavic Festival* is a musical celebration of the Slavic nations and their traditional culture.

The opening of the piece should be strong but not heavy. Keep the staccato quarter notes separated throughout to maintain a dance-like feel. The principal melody bounces from one section to another and should never be obscured by another section.

The contrasting theme beginning in measure 57 should be played lightly at both the softer and louder dynamic levels. If possible, the flutes should play the upper pitches. All entrances in measures 85 and 86 should be heard equally. For a little fun, consider an *accelerando* from measure 89 to the end of the piece.

Slavic Festival is a really fun work to rehearse and perform but can also be used as the point of departure for a further exploration of world music. I wish you and your students all the best.

The Horns (Hn.) provide harmonic support. The Trombone (Tbn.), Baritone (Bar.), Euphonium (Euph.), and Bass Trombone (Bsn.) parts are primarily harmonic. The Tuba part provides a steady bass line. The Percussion section includes Timpani (Timp.), Bells, Snare Drum (S.D.), Bass Drum (B.D.), Triangle (Tri.), and Cymbal (Cr. Cym.). The Tambourine (Tamb.) part is active in measures 49 and 50.
