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Jamie Roth, a native of South Florida, is an accomplished composer, arranger, educator, and woodwind performer. Roth holds a Bachelor of Music from Florida Atlantic University and a Master of Studio Jazz Writing from the University of Miami. Upon graduation, he began his teaching career at FAU teaching music theory, orchestration, and music technology.

He has been a National Board Certified Educator since 2004. In 2007, he was awarded the Outstanding Secondary Teacher Award from the Florida Atlantic University Department of Education and was elected one of FMEA's Emerging Leaders. Mr. Roth has served the Florida Bandmasters Association as both District 15 Secretary and Chairman and is a seasoned FBA adjudicator in the areas of Solo and Ensemble, Concert Bands, and Jazz Music Performance. He has been seen presenting sessions at many music conferences including JEN, FMEA, NAfME, and at the Midwest clinic.

Mr. Roth performs regularly with various Rock/Funk Horn Bands, Wind Ensembles, Musical Pit Orchestras, and Jazz Big Bands throughout the United States. Mr. Roth is regularly commissioned to write for a variety of school and professional wind, pop/rock, and jazz bands of all ability levels. Recently, his works have been performed by the United States Airmen of Note and the University of Miami Frost School of Music's Henry Mancini Big Band. Jamie has also had his arrangements performed by Randy Brecker on his Big Band engagements. Mr. Roth's reputation for tuneful, intriguing, and playable compositions and arrangements has earned his work a place in many educational and professional band libraries.

He is a member of the NAfME, BMI, Jazz Education Network, Florida Bandmasters Association, Florida Music Educators Association, and the International Society of Jazz Arrangers and Composers.

Notes

Catch 22 is an exhilarating contemporary jazz fusion piece that captures the essence of its namesake paradox. Its syncopated rhythms create a sense of anticipation and tension, making it a thrilling challenge for intermediate and advanced players alike. The synthesizer solo sets the stage with its bright tempo, while muted trumpets and saxes introduce the melody, supported by bari sax and bass bone.

As the ensemble builds to a peak, the piece showcases cluster chord patterns, adding depth and complexity to the composition. Throughout the performance, the catchy melody and intricate counterpoint keep the audience engaged, while the use of flugel horns adds a unique texture to the trumpet section. With ample solo opportunities for any instrument, Catch 22 promises an electrifying musical experience that shouldn't be missed.





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
