PROGRAM NOTES

A Rocket To The Sun was composed to commemorate the August 12, 2018, launch of NASA's Parker Solar Probe, a rocket to study the sun. It is the first rocket ever to get within 4 million miles of the sun's surface, and it will face more heat and radiation than any before it. The purpose of the Parker Solar Probe's mission is to study the solar winds, which are responsible for the northern lights. It will also provide valuable research data for space weather, which can interfere with technology on earth. The rocket will study the outer layer of the sun, called the corona, and help us understand why the corona is in fact hotter than the sun's surface.

The mission of the Parker Solar Probe will last 6 years and 11 months and is scheduled to be complete in 2025. The Parker Solar Probe was named after astrophysicist Eugene Parker, who in the 1950s developed the theory of the solar winds.

NOTES TO CONDUCTOR

A Rocket To The Sun would be appropriate as a concert opener or closer. It offers the opportunity to connect students and audiences with current scientific discovery.

A Rocket To The Sun is a good piece to program after teaching the Bb concert scale. The oboe part can serve as an optional second flute part in a band with no oboes. The first and second trumpet parts allow for the differentiation of range among young trumpet students. The clarinets do not go over the break, but do venture into the lower register in preparation of doing so.

The ascending accented notes could be said to represent the rising of the rocket ship. These should contrast with the more lyrical style at measure 25,

I wish you and the band a very successful educational experience and performance.
