PROGRAM NOTE

Simple, yet elegant and graceful, *Blue* is the second movement from *Krisanna's Colors*, a suite composed to honor an amazing young musician who inspired her entire community and beyond. Facing difficult health challenges, Krisanna wanted to be a very positive role model for all that came in contact with her. As a result, when asked how her day was going, she responded with a color. A "sunshiny yellow day" was bright, happy and joyous. A red day was very intense with a wide range of emotions. A blue day was quiet, reflective and, at times, a little sad and lonely.

NOTES TO CONDUCTOR

The opening solo should be as expressive as possible conveying a sense of warmth and reflection. As the 1st violin section joins leading into measure 9, please take care to emulate the phrasing and interpretation of the soloist. The rest of the probestra should be carefully vertically balanced beginning at measure 10 to highlight the harmonic structure and warmth. Care should be given to the shape of the crescendo in order to maintain the harmonic balance. The piano should be very light beginning at measure 9 adding just a bit of "sparkle" to the performance.

Please note the crescendo/decrescendo effect beginning at measure 17. This dynamic movement is crucial to the forward momentum of the piece.

The 2nd violins present the melody going into measure 25. I have cued the melodic line in the 1st violins for use as needed. However, in educational settings, this is an opportunity for the 2nd violins to be featured with expression and artistry. Please balance the celli against the 2nd violins to insure presence in their countermelodic line.

Feel free to maximize the rallentando into measure 34 with an emphasis on the crescendo. Note the *a tempo* at 34. This dramatic moment should have a sense of momentum and strength leading to the soft and reflective ending to come.

I wish you and your orchestra the very best in your performance. I hope Blue proves to be a rewarding musical experience for all
