#### **PROGRAM NOTE**

Composed in an exciting Latin style, *Chase the Heat* evokes imagery of bright sunlight and sizzling temperatures. Latin percussion instruments are featured throughout in various ways, and the infectious groove propels the piece to an exciting finish.

#### **NOTES TO CONDUCTOR**

Using only the first six notes introduced in most band methods, this piece is designed to reinforce very early concepts taught in the beginning band setting.

This provides an opportunity to introduce musical layers to your developing musicians. Direct their listening to the bass line introduced at measure 3, melody at measure 7, and countermelody in the upper woodwinds and alto sax at measure 15. Each part should be heard clearly as it enters. This experience will help develop the band's sense of ensemble balance.

Percussion should work to maintain the tempo while not overbalancing the ensemble and the aforementioned group entrances.

Measure 23 should be a brief contrasting section with the low brass striving for a connected legato style. This section also provides an opportunity to discuss call and response along with balance between the low voices and clarinet/saxophone parts.

Strive for a dramatic crescendo leading into measure 33 to bring the piece to an exciting finish.

It is my sincere hope that this piece proves to be educational and fun for your ensemble. Have a great performance!

**Bryce Newton** (b. 1983) is an active arranger, composer, and music educator in the Dayton, Ohio area.
