PROGRAM NOTE

Water Dance is a whimsical piece that draws inspiration from a vision of droplets creating rippled images in the water.

The composer writes, "I pictured sunlight reflecting off the water's surface and getting caught in the rising mist. This scene creates space for all kinds of imagination due to the mysterious combination of water and light that is so intriguing to all. I have always had a strange affinity for water. Consequently, I find myself getting lost in its beauty quite often."

NOTES TO CONDUCTOR

When the violins play the intervals of seconds in the tremolo sections, it would be helpful to split the notes evenly between Violin 1 and 2. I suggest alternating the note assignments between every other player to help the musicians blend and lock in the interval.

If the switches from pizzicato to arco are difficult for some players, feel free to stagger those transitions. I suggest directing some players to end the pizzicato early to start the arco on time. The others should play the complete pizzicato phrase and start the arco a little later. However, this should be a last resort solution. Encourage the players to drill these transitions to continue the development of their technique.

I hope you and the orchestra find Water Dance to be a fun and engaging piece.

Born and raised in Panama City, Florida, she has deep roots in the south eastern United States and loves her coastal heritage. In her senior year she recorded her debut studio album, *Take Me Away* (by Jesselyn Joy).
